Women's Ministries News

Dear Church Family,

It's been on my heart to have a little chat with you about our White Cross International Ministries. Women's Ministries has a line item in our yearly budget and I would like to explain to you where our money goes. White Cross funds go directly to our missionaries/partners and do not go to administration.

Our Women's Ministries Group has evolved from our ABW Program which met monthly. Each meeting consisted of a "program", love gift offering, project offering and fellowship. Usually a fund raiser was held (dinner etc.) for the regional project and also the national project. As the group grew smaller, it was difficult to continue and the few new members wanted a different format. Thus a Bible Study began and a few of us are continuing with the White Cross Program. The Bible Study is a weekly event and once or twice a year we have a bandage rolling day with all the ladies helping. In the past, we would cut quilt blocks and mail them to the Philippines; we can no longer do this. Even though we pay the postage they would have to pay a tariff or tax to receive it and could not afford it.

Each fall we are given a Purchase Plan Request from the Luther Rice Association. It comes with a form to accept or decline these requests. We have always been able to accept them thanks to the church body and monies in this line item. This year our Overseas requests were as follows:* 30 – 5" by 10 Yd bandages to the Congo (we were able to make 32 in one morning thanks to the "rolling machines" designed and made by Frank Robbs) *\$194.00 to India *\$15.00 to the Republic of Georgia. These requests were completed and mailed this past week. In December our Overland requests were for Bethel Neighborhood Center and were taken there in December. I want to thank you for your continued support.
